**General Wesley Clark to Headline
Wind Power Forum: The New Energy Economy
HUSUM WindEnergy Congress to Address Worldwide Wind Energy Development**

HUSUM, Germany (Aug. 18, 2008) – Gen. Wesley Clark will lead the opening session of “Wind Power Forum: The New Energy Economy,” a worldwide wind energy forum during the HUSUM WindEnergy trade show and congress in Husum, Germany Sept. 9-13, 2008.

Clark is a former Supreme Allied Commander of NATO and U.S. presidential candidate. He currently is president of Wesley K. Clark & Associates, LLC, a strategic consulting firm in Little Rock, Ark., and member of the Emergya Wind Technologies board of directors.

The Wind Power Forum: The New Energy Economy will take place on the first day of HUSUM WindEnergy, the world’s largest, longest-running and best-attended wind energy industry trade fair. The Global Wind Energy Council (GWEC), the international partner of HUSUM WindEnergy, organized the forum. The United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) is a supporting partner.

“This discussion will highlight the important economic benefits of wind energy to regions around the world,” said GWEC Secretary General Steve Sawyer. “General Clark is a strong, globally recognized leader who understands the value of wind energy in terms of the environment and economic opportunities for communities around the world. We’re delighted he is a member of our expert panel.”

In addition to Clark, confirmed speakers include German Minister for Economics and Technology Michael Glos and Schleswig-Holstein’s Minister-President Peter Harry Carstensen. Schleswig-Holstein is the northern federal state where Husum is located. Additional panelists will represent specific regional authorities from China, Denmark, Germany, Spain and the United States.

Sawyer said the forum’s objectives are to raise political awareness among decision-makers and ensure they are informed on the state of wind energy technologies and the opportunities wind energy provides in terms of electricity production, job creation, economic growth and environmental impact reduction.

The HUSUM WindEnergy trade show will feature products, services and innovations from 700 exhibitors from 35 countries, including wind turbine manufacturers, suppliers and service providers. More than 20,000 visitors from 40 countries are expected.

The accompanying congress will feature nearly 60 seminars relevant to international wind energy, including sessions regarding recent innovations in the industry, presentations by leaders of countries new to wind energy development, and an international conference on wind energy in North America.

HUSUM WindEnergy has developed into an international event, with the number of companies and organizations from Europe continuing to grow and increasing demand for exhibition space from the United States and Canada. Asian interest also is on the rise, especially from companies in Korea, China, Japan and Taiwan.

HUSUM WindEnergy is climate neutral and supported by a number of national and international trade associations, including Bundesverband Windenergie, the Global

About General Wesley K. Clark

Wesley K. Clark retired a four star general after 38 years in the United States Army. He graduated first in his class at West Point and completed degrees in Philosophy, Politics and Economics at Oxford University (B.A. and M.A.) as a Rhodes Scholar. While serving in Vietnam, he commanded an infantry company in combat, where he was severely wounded and evacuated home on a stretcher. He commanded at the battalion, brigade and division level, and served in a number of significant staff positions, including service as the Director Strategic Plans and Policy (J-5). He finished his career as NATO commander and Supreme Allied Commander Europe where he led NATO forces to victory in Operation Allied Force, saving 1.5 million Albanians from ethnic cleansing. His awards include the Defense Distinguished Service Medal (five awards), Silver star, bronze star, purple heart, honorary knighthoods from the British and Dutch governments, and numerous other awards from other governments, including award of Commander of the Legion of Honor (France). General Clark authored three books and serves as Chairman and CEO of Wesley K. Clark & Associates, a strategic consulting firm; Chairman of investment bank Rodman & Renshaw; Director of Emergya Wind Technologies, BV and is a senior fellow at UCLA's Burkle Center for International Relations, Chairman of City Year Little Rock and Director International Crisis Group.
